In association with chemists, a Western Australian woman created the enviro products. Judith Wilson could not use regular brands of household cleaning products and reacted to many personal care products due to skin sensitivities and allergies. Researching into ingredients that may be causing her problems, she realised that many of the ingredients used in everyday products could result in harmful effects for everyone, not just those with allergies. Hence she set about putting a range of household, personal care and pet products together.

These products are **enviROCLEAN**, **enviROCARE** and **enviROPET**.

What is not in our products and why...

These ingredients are potentially harmful to human skin, we decided pet health and skin care is as important as our own.

Petrochemicals: Petroleum based chemicals that transmit into Xeno-estrogens. These unnatural estrogens are absorbed through the skin, and can affect hormone balance and respiratory systems.

Caustics & Lye: Irritate skin and are still used in most soaps to break down tallow (animal fat).

DEA Diethanolamine: is used as a lathering agent in shampoos, body cleansers, etc. and is a skin and eye irritant.

SLS and SLES (Sodium laurel sulfate, sodium lauryl sulphate, sodium lauryl ether sulphate). A common ingredient used in shampoos. The thickening agent, sodium chloride (common salt) is harmful to hair and the scalp causing dryness, itching and in some cases hair loss.
